Initial placement testing will impact the sequence of courses. MAT 100 and WRT 101 are counted as electives. Remember: 120 credits must be completed to satisfy the degree requirements.

Because you have variable options (3 or 4 credit courses) it is important to keep track of your total semester hours to be sure you reach 122 by the end of your 4th semester.
