Comprehensive Examination:

Pass a written comprehensive examination. The comprehensive examination will consist of four questions from at least two different faculty members. At least two of the questions have to be in the major field. To be eligible to take the comprehensive examination, the student must complete all course work prior to or within the semester in which the comprehensive exam is taken. The student must have at that time an average of "B" or better in his or her coursework. Students should contact the graduate coordinator to schedule the comprehensive examination.
