October 14, 2002 - Dr. Paul M. Simon convened the first meeting of the year. Because of the number of students on this committee, the chair is not elected until the first meeting of the new academic year. Dr. Simon discussed the role and responsibilities of the committee and was subsequently elected chair. The committee discussed its priorities for the year.

October 21, 2002 - no quorum

November 11, 2002 - The committee developed its priority list for the year. The committee discussed its concern that there is NO substance abuse counselor at the university.

November 25, 2002 - The issue of the substance abuse counselor was again discussed and the committee requested immediate action from the administration. The Disruptive Behavior in the Classroom policy was reviewed.

December 9, 2002 - no quorum

February 10, 2003 - Parking was the main topic of discussion. A multi-level garage will replace the student lot and that will disrupt parking for about one year. Public Safety presented a number of suggestions concerning who would park where, when. A revised copy of the disruptive behavior was distributed. The need for weekend programming was discussed. The issue is tied into the alcohol awareness program. Dr. Simon stated he is ready to begin programming; but is waiting for the administration to provide answers to the shuttle and food service issues.

March 12, 2003 - The committee voted to revise the bylaws by changing the quorum requirement. Currently seven members make a quorum but four of those must be students. The committee changed the requirement to two students. Public Safety presented an updated parking plan.

April 16, 2003 - The committee continued reviewing the parking issue. It was noted that in none of the drafts was the Ramada Inn students discussed -- where they residents or commuters. The committee had major concerns with the disruptive behavior policy.
