Westside Student Center

Western Connecticut State University, founded in 1903, is just a one-and-a-half hour journey from New York City, three hours from Boston and a short, spectacular drive to skiing in Connecticut's beautiful Northwest Corner! . Campuses WestConn's two beautiful campuses, only a few miles apart, are distinctly different. Our 34-acre Middtown campus evokes both our 100-year history and our 21st century commitment to the future. Students stroll pleasant pathways across a center green; classroom buildings are only a short distance from parking garages and residence halls. And just off campus, small shops and fine restaurants are a short walk away. Courses also are offered at WestConn at Waterbury. Westside campus pours on the country charm. Woods and lawn surround the classroom building, residence halls, Westside Athletic Complex, Westside Campus Center, observatory and playing fields. Students commute via our convenient shuttle buses or by car for classes, games and university events. WestConn's new Science Building was chosen Best of 2006 by New York Construction Magazine. It is a state-of-the-art, 122,000-square-foot facility and the first state-funded project to receive Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design, or LEED, silver certification from the U.S. Green Building Council. As such, it is the university's premier example of its proactive focus on maintaining the health of our shared environment.

Why WestConn?

Students thrive at WestConn, anticipating the leadership careers for which they've been prepared by the university's cutting-edge programs. Here at WestConn, we recognize that today's freshmen can and do rise to become tomorrow's top educators, corporate CEOs, TV personalities, environmental experts, jazz guitarists and political figures. That's why we design our degree curricula around a strategic blend of foundation courses that define their disciplines and state-of-the-art courses that derive from an ever-evolving body of knowledge. Faculty first; all else follows. The University offers 37 undergraduate programs and 17 master's degree programs. The already low cost to students may be supplemented by financial aid, which is used by 40% of all full-time students. Western has approximately 7,000 students, approximately 4,500 of them full-time undergraduates. Western has six residence halls offering co-educational and apartment-style living, which provide housing for almost 30% of undergraduates. The Housing Office will assist in making housing arrangements in the Danbury area.

Athletics and Clubs

The 79,000-square-foot William A. O'Neill Athletic and Convocation Center opened in January of 1995. In 2005, the Westside Athletic Complex opened on the Westside campus. The WAC features a state-of-the-art SprintTurf surface, seating for 2,500, offices for coaches, a training and equipment room and several locker rooms.

Fourteen intercollegiate athletics programs are offered including football, women's and men's soccer, women's volleyball, women's tennis and field hockey in the fall; men's and women's basketball and women's swimming in the winter; and baseball, softball, men's tennis and men's and women's lacrosse in the spring. There are more than 60 student clubs and organizations on campus.

Freshman Admission Guidelines

Each application is assessed individually. Listed below are the general guidelines used in evaluating an applicant's academic record.

- High school diploma or GED
- SAT (1000 guideline) — Reading comp/math
- Rank in Class (RIC) — top 50%
- B minus average in the following:
 - 4 years of English
 - 3 years math (Alg. I, Geom., Alg. 2)
 - 2 years social sciences, including U.S. history
 - 2 years laboratory science
 - 2 to 3 years foreign language (3 recommended)

Nursing, education and business departments may have additional requirements. Coursework in computer science, visual arts, theatre arts, music or dance may be substituted for one of the above academic areas.

Applications for the fall semester should be received by May 1.

Transfer Students



The O'Neill Center

Applicants are considered to be transfer students if they have 12 or more credits. A minimum of a 2.0 cumulative GPA is required for consideration for all students with 12 to 45 credits. Students with 45 or more credits will be required to meet academic major GPA standards to be admitted.

Application Considerations

- Fall semester — rolling admissions begin Dec. 1
- Spring semester — rolling admissions begin Oct. 1
- WCSU admissions application
- \$50 application fee
- High school transcripts
- SAT 1 scores, senior year recommended (ACT results also are accepted). If English is not the applicant's first language, a 213 score or higher on the TOEFL must be submitted in lieu of, or in addition to, the SAT scores. Transfer students must file an application and pay the \$50 application fee. Official transcripts from every college attended should be sent to WestConn's Admission Office.

University Scholars Program

This is an advanced program of study for talented students who want additional academic challenge. Academic scholarships are available. (1100 SAT and RIC top 15% guideline)

Financial Aid

Scholarship and financial aid candidates must complete the Free Application For Student Aid (FAFSA). The output document resulting from FAFSA must be received in WestConn's data files with a valid index number by March 30 in order for you to be considered an on-time applicant. The recommended electronic filing date is March 15.

The O'Neill Center

The Colonials play their home games at the William A. O'Neill Athletic and Convocation Center and the Stephen Feldman Arena. The 75,000 square foot facility, located on the university's Westside Campus, opened in December of 1994. The arena houses a portable parquet floor and seating for 2,800. The O'Neill Center and Western Connecticut State University were the hosts to the 1999, 2000 and 2001 NCAA Division III Women's Basketball Finals.



Directions to O'Neill Center

Interstate 84 is the prime connector, passing through Danbury east-west. I-84 connects with I-684 in New York toward Westchester County and NY City. I-84 passes through Hartford (where it connects with I-91) and extends through Connecticut and meets the Mass. Turnpike toward Boston.

From I-84 Westbound (New England, points east)

- Take Exit 4
- Turn right onto Lake Ave.
- Turn right at 3rd traffic light
- Head up hill to Westside Campus
- O'Neill Center last building on right (White & Blue Building)
- Use front entrance for all visiting teams

From I-84 Eastbound (NY, NJ and points south and west)

- Take Exit 4
- Turn right onto Lake Ave.
- Turn right at 4th traffic light
- Head up hill to Westside Campus
- O'Neill Center last building on right (White & Blue Building)
- Use front entrance for all visiting teams

The Coaching Staff



Head Coach - Bob Campbell

Bob Campbell begins his 27th season as Western Connecticut State University's longest tenured head coach.

Campbell has the highest winning percentage of any coach in the program's 64-year history with an overall record of 497 wins and 212 losses, a .701 winning percentage. His other accomplishments with the Colonials include:

- 10 seasons with 20 or more wins, including seven consecutive from 1988 to 1995.
- 10 invitations to the NCAA tournament, advancing to at least the second round six times.
- Five Little East Conference championships.
- 28-2 overall record and a #2 National ranking in a 1989-90 season that ended in an OT loss in the Elite Eight of the NCAA tournament.
- A school record 20 straight wins during the 1985-86 season.

During the 1989-90 season, the Colonials opened with 19 straight victories, and after an 80-63 loss to Hartwick College, regained their composure and won nine of their last 10. Western's season-ending win streak came to a close in the finals of the Atlantic/Middle Atlantic Sectionals, (The Elite Eight) with a 107-104 overtime loss to host Washington of Maryland.

A Danbury native, Campbell graduated from the University of Connecticut, where he worked with coaching legends Jim Valvano, Dom Perino and United States Olympic Coach Dee Rowe. Campbell received his master's degree from Columbia University.

Following graduation from UConn, Campbell taught in the Danbury school system and broke into coaching at Danbury High School.

Campbell came to Western in 1980-81 as a part-time coach, assisting three different head coaches, before taking over WCSU's program in 1984.

In addition to his responsibilities at WestConn, Campbell has coached at the World Student-Athlete Games held in Newport, RI (1994), and was selected the basketball coordinator for the 1990 Nutmeg Games, Connecticut's Olympics.

Quick has been Head Coach at Glastonbury High School, Hartford Public High School, and most recently at Daniel Webster College. His knowledge of the game, work ethic, and tireless recruiting will certainly help the Colonials this year and in the future.

Pete Szklarz enters his first season with Bob Campbell's staff at Western Connecticut.

Prior to this season, Szklarz was a Head Varsity Coach for two seasons at Danvers (MA) High School while teaching history there.

He graduated from and played basketball at Salem State University. While in a Vikings' uniform, Szklarz was a two-year captain and appeared in the 2000 NCAA Division III National Finals. That season, Salem State finished with an impressive 27-5 overall record.



Mike Yoder enters his first season with Bob Campbell's staff at Western Connecticut.

Yoder graduated from Endicott College last May with a degree in Physical Education. While there, he was a member of the men's basketball team and captained the 2009-10 squad.

He has worked at Hoop Mountain events and at various camps near his hometown of Mahopac, NY.

During the season, he will assist the staff in scouting, recruiting, player skill development and drill instruction.
