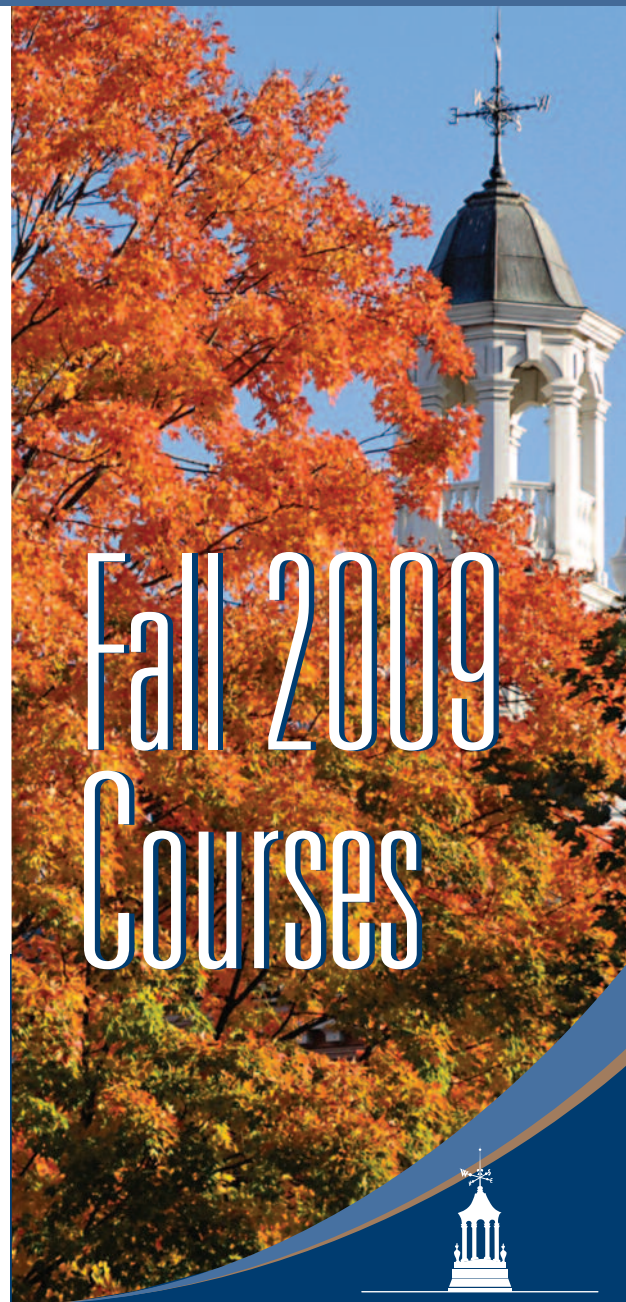

11605 ENG 105-71 Introduction to Poetry 3 SH
W 5 – 7:30 p.m.
Staff Founders Hall 208
Study of varieties of poetry — pastoral, elegy, lyric, ballad, sonnet, epic — in order to introduce students to a cross-cultural literary form. The course opens poetry to novices and develops their ability to read highly concentrated language. Not for major credit. *General Education: Humanities/Literature.*

11267 HIS 246-71 Judaism 3 SH

J. Frankle Founders Hall 202
A survey of the history of the Jewish people and their religion from the earliest times to the present. *General Education: Humanities/Western History.*

11441 MAT 118-74 Elementary Applied Math 3 SH
M 5 – 7:30 p.m.
Staff Founders Hall 208
Fundamental mathematical tools useful in the study of business and the social sciences, including matrices and polynomial calculus. Not open to students who have completed MAT 181 or 135. **Prerequisite:** MAT 100 or appropriate test score. *General Education: CS/Mathematics.*

10882 PS 104-72 World Governments, Economies and Cultures 3 SH
W 7:35 – 10:05 p.m.
P. Wagner Founders Hall 202
Political, historical, economic and socio-cultural perspectives are used to examine the problems and prospects of the contemporary world. Course topics will be selected in terms of current global issues and developments. *General Education: Social Sciences.*

10913 PSY 203-71 Clinical Psychology 3 SH
R 6 – 8:30 p.m.
K. Matthews Founders Hall 208
A course which focuses on theories, diagnostic techniques and treatment modalities in the field of clinical psychology. Consideration will also be given to social, legal and philosophical issues in the assessment and treatment of mental illness as well as in problems of daily living. **Prerequisite:** PSY 100. *General Education: Behavioral Science.*

11611 SPA 170-71 Practical Spanish for Health Professionals 3 SH
W 6 – 8:30 p.m.
Staff Founders Hall 204
Introduces health personnel to the basics in structure and grammar and familiarizes the student with the vocabulary and terminology necessary for communication with Spanish-speaking people. *General Education: Humanities/Foreign Language.*

Business Courses

11321 FIN 230-72 Business Statistics 3 SH
R 6:45 – 9:15 p.m.
H. Namiot Founders Hall 205
This course is an applications-oriented study of basic statistical concepts and techniques. Focus is on the use of descriptive and inferential statistics as an aid to managerial decision-making and on computer-based analysis of data. Topics include charts and graphs, distributions, measures of central tendency and dispersion, probability, sampling, estimation, hypothesis tests, correlation, regression and time series. **Prerequisite:** MAT 118 or 133 or 135.

10585 MGT 320-71 Operations Management 3 SH
R 4 – 6:30 p.m.
C. Chuang Founders Hall 202
This course is concerned with the management of the production function of organizations in which services and goods are produced. This management process is separated into the general areas of scheduling, quality, materials and methods. The course presents concepts and tools necessary for effective and efficient management of these areas, their strong interactions and their effects on employees. **Prerequisite:** FIN 230 and junior standing.

10587 MGT 340-71 Total Quality Management 3 SH
R 6:45 – 9:15 p.m.
M. Case Founders Hall 202
The concepts, principles and tools known as Total Quality Management, used in organizations of all types to improve customer and consumer satisfaction, are covered. Content includes a discussion of quality systems in both production and service environments, quality management philosophies, and how managers can plan, organize and maintain quality of all functions of their organizations. **Prerequisite:** MGT 250 and GPA > 2.3.

10591 MGT 376-71 Managing People 3 SH
T 5:25 – 7:55 p.m.
Staff Founders Hall 208
This course views managing as a set of processes focusing on the manager, those managed, and the work they do. The roles, skills, competencies, ethics and knowledge used by managers are emphasized. **Prerequisite:** MGT 250, GPA > 2.3.

Exploration of the role of the professional nurse and transition of the registered nurse graduate's transition to that role. Foundational concepts related to nursing practice, wellness, and illness are explored within a framework of role transformation. **Prerequisite:** Open only to RN students. **Co-requisite:** HPX 205 by transfer or challenge examination.

Consideration of the community as a unit of health care. Focuses on the care of population aggregates and at-risk groups. **Prerequisite:** NUR 201, 205; BIO 215. **Co-requisite:** NUR 225, 235, 300, HPX 205.

E. Abate Waterbury Clinical/Hospital
T 3 p.m. – 4:50 p.m.
E. Abate Founders Hall 210
Focus on the concept of the community as a unit of health care, with application of the nursing process in providing care in the home and other community settings. **Prerequisite:** NUR 255, 300, 361. **Co-requisite:** NUR 325.

10838 NUR 332-71 Pharmacotherapeutics Across the Lifespan 3 SH
T 5 p.m. – 7:50 p.m.
L. Dalessio Founders Hall 204
An in-depth analysis of common pharmacotherapeutics and diagnostics used currently in patient care. **Prerequisite:** admission into the nursing major.
