Up-and- coming future Doctoral Degrees:

Prof. Doreen Graham – Defended proposal and is now working on Chapter 4 & 5, Data Collection and Analyzation for her research project about "Novice Nurse Practitioner's Perception of Role Transition."

Prof. Teresa Puckhaber '16 is working on a proposal about Academic Nurse Educators and Teaching Efficacy, Psychological Empowerment, and Empowering Teaching Behaviors.

Reassigned Time for Research:

Dr. Mary Ellen Doherty has reassigned time for "Exploring Post Traumatic Growth in Women who have experienced loss of spouse or partner." Series of other studies coming: Post Traumatic Growth in Women who have lost a child, had a near death experience, have been emotionally / physically abused, and/or lived through natural disaster. All of this research will be used toward writing a book titled "Exemplars of Post Traumatic Growth."

Dr. Doherty is also presenting her research at ENRS in Boston, Massachusetts and American College of Nurse Midwives in Austin, Texas.

Dr. Doherty received word that she will receive an honor of "Fellow" in American College of Nurse Midwives at their annual meeting in June 2020.

Up-and-Coming Changes:

This coming Spring 2020, we are moving on up. Where do you ask? We are moving our department to the second floor of White Hall. This is targeted to happen somewhere around the end of spring semester. What else is expanding?

Western Connecticut State University is pleased to announce their new Psychiatric Nurse Practitioner program. This program requires a completion of 47 credits of specialized professional course designed to prepare the student in becoming a Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner. The program is designed for part-time study with courses being offered in the evening, hybrid or online. Part-time study requires approximately four years for completion. At the end of the program students will be eligible to sit for the certifying board exam Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Certification (PMHNP-BC).
