AccessAbility Services, in partnership with the Counseling Center and the Office of Diversity and Equity is excited to announce, "Filling in the Gaps- Addressing Mental Health on WCSU's Campus". An interactive presentation by Laura DiGalbo a nationally known expert on mental health and the intersection of mental health on college campuses. Over the last several years, AccessAbility Services has seen an increased number of students with psychological disabilities enrolled at WCSU. 




