





Human Library


When: Tuesday, Oct. 1, 2019 from 1 to 5 pm

The Western Connecticut State University Libraries will host the first Human Library event at WCSU offering members of the university and area communities an opportunity to hold one-on-one conversations with "human books" — volunteers from diverse backgrounds who will share their unique stories and challenges. The Human Library event aims to contribute to greater tolerance and understanding between people locally and worldwide. It is a method to create dialogue between very different individuals who would not otherwise have had an opportunity to talk together. The Human Library Organization is a Danish idea from 2000 and is now available in more than 80 countries.

Why you should go – WCSU Director of Library Services Veronica Kenausis explained that the Human Library "is an event at WCSU is an opportunity to have positive conversations to challenge stereotypes and prejudices, to learn about a career, or just to get to know another individual from a different background."



The Ancell School of Business at WCSU is installing a chapter of the international Beta Gamma Sigma (BGS) honor society, joining over 450 other business school




programs accredited by The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB International). chapters operate globally in almost 75% of AACSB-accredited business schools.





Transfer students have less time to get fully prepared for a successful experience. They need to find everything on campus, acclimate themselves to all new info and resources and then hopefully find a job by the time they graduate in two or so years. Ancell understands this and is one of the reasons why we developed TransferMation. We wanted to fast-track transfer students to success on every level here at WCSU.

In Fall 2019, TransferMation launched on BlackBoard Learn as an online resource and ORG for incoming Ancell transfer students. We had some fantastic feedback and decided to create an accessible version to the public as well. Simply visit wcsu.edu/asb/transfermation/ to view and download.




