Health Promotion Studies (HPX) majors study public health, emphasizing creating programs to educate communities to maintain physical and mental health. They learn how to help people live healthier lives to prevent and manage disease. As medical costs and mental health challenges skyrocket, health promotion is taking an increasingly important role in our society. Study options can include Allied Health, Community Health, Holistic and Integrative Health and Fitness and Wellness. HPX is a springboard to many possible career paths in health care, including community health educator, health inspector, recreation therapy, physical/occupational therapy, naturopathy, exercise physiology, and more. Health promotion is important to many different organizations, including nonprofits, clinical settings, corporate organizations, emergency medical fields and schools.

According to the <u>Bureau of Labor Statistics</u> and the Occupational Outlook Handbook, employment of health care occupations is projected to grow significantly,12% from 2021 to 2031, much faster than the average for all occupations. Students who study Health Promotion often seek one of many professional certifications in health education, fitness and training, and the allied health professions.
