Management Information Systems (MIS) majors study how technology and related organizational processes can meet the evolving needs of businesses and other enterprises. Knowledge of networks, hardware and software, as well as essential business processes is required to understand and solve an organization's technical needs. This degree can help open doors for a wide variety of career paths in both business and technology, including information systems manager, application developer, network architect, systems analyst, social media consultant, web developer, and more.

According to the <u>Bureau of Labor Statistics</u>, employment of computer and information technology occupations is projected to grow 16% from 2021 to 2031, much faster than the average for all occupations. Demand for these workers will stem from greater emphasis on cloud computing, the collection and storage of big data, and information security. Experience in related positions and professional certifications provide a competitive edge for MIS professionals and can include Information Systems Analyst Program (ISP), Associate Computing Professional (ACP), Project Management Professional (PMP), Certified Business Analyst Professional (CBAP), and Certified Information System Auditor (CISA).
