#### **Position summary:**

- > Be able to work long days, if needed
- Accessible throughout the academic year to participate in other orientation programs as well as large events at the University, if needed
- > Able to stay overnight, room will be provided, if needed
- > Desire to assist new students in their transition to campus community
- > Desire to be a leader and role-model, including on-campus, on-line, and in the community
- > Be a team player, flexible, adaptable, dependable, and punctual
- > Possess a positive attitude, ability to work with diverse students, parents, faculty, and staff
- > Most importantly, must want to have fun!
