DANBURY HOSPITAL (NUVANCE) MOBILE TESTING FOR CORONAVIRUS

Mobile testing available 8:30 am to 3:30 pm at Danbury Hospital. You must have a prescription from your physician and an appointment. Please review the steps below and Call 203-738-4344 to schedule an appointment.

COVID-19 Testing: A Step-by-Step Guide
Part 1: Order Test Danbury

- 1 Are you displaying symptoms, such as fever, dry cough, and shortness of breath?
 NO Stay home
 YES Go to 2
- 2 Call your doctor. Tell him or her your symptoms and other information. Your doctor may:
 Not order a test Stay home
 Order a Test Go to 3
- 3 Your doctor will provide a number to schedule an appointment at Danbury Hospital's drive-through collection site.
- 4 Call the appointment hotline to schedule an appointment for within one business day. The collection site hours of operation are 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM, Monday to Saturday.

Do NOT go to a Collection Site without a scheduled appointment and an approved test order from a doctor.

Part 2: Be Prepared Danbury

Where to Go
 The Danbury Hospital drive-through testing area is located at 95 Locust Avenue in Danbury, near the corner of Locust Ave. and Osborne Ave.



What to Bring

- A government-issued photo ID (such as a driver's license or passport)
- Your health insurance card (if you have one)

NOTE: Bring no more than one passenger with you. Cars with more than two occupants will not be allowed into the testing area.

COVID-19 Testing: A Step-by-Step Guide
Part 3: When You Arrive Danbury

- 1 Drive up to the first attendant and present your Photo ID and insurance card.
- 2 They will give you an Access Card to move to the next station for a test. Only approved patients with test orders will receive an Access Card.
- 3 A medical professional will use a swab to collect a specimen sample from your nose.

NOTE: Do NOT leave your vehicle at any point in the testing process. Each step will take place through your open car window.

COVID-19 Testing: A Step-by-Step Guide
Part 4: Back at Home Danbury

- 1 After testing, begin to self-quarantine. This means strict, personal isolation for 14 days. If you are living with others, try to limit shared spaces like bathrooms.
- 2 Your doctor will contact you with test results within six days. Do not reach out to your doctor about results unless you have gone 7+ days without a response.
