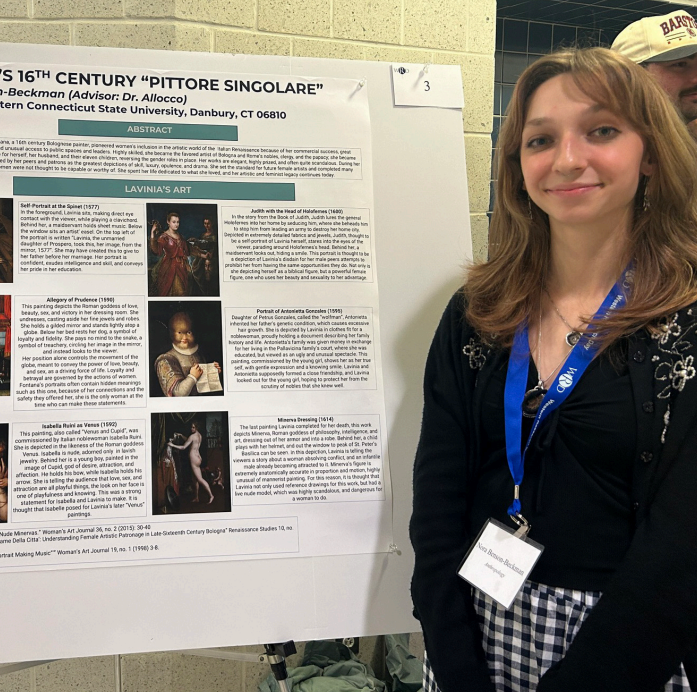

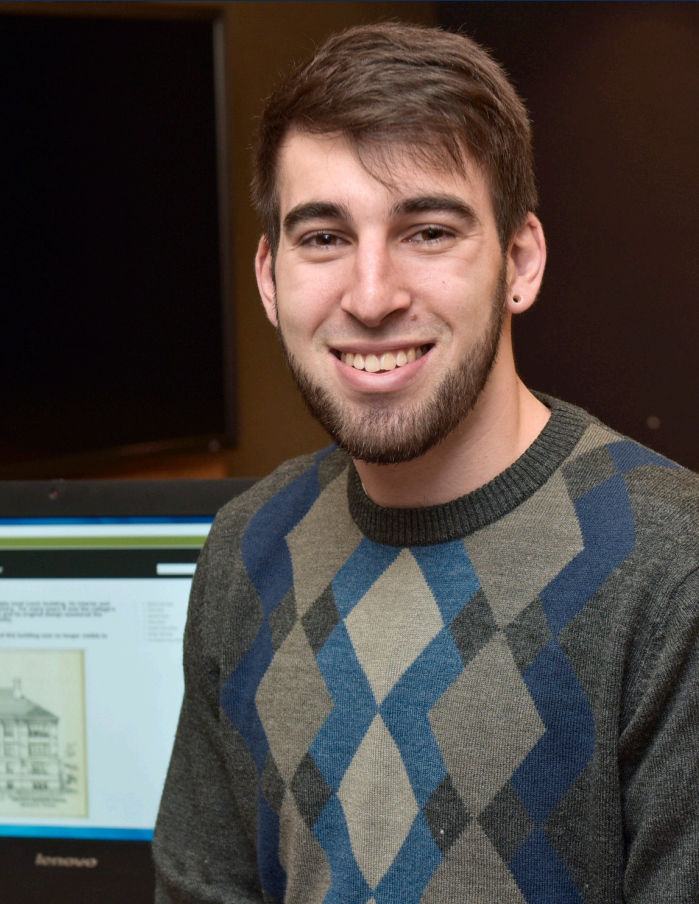

OVERVIEW:

This is an accelerated program that allows students to complete the BA in History and the MA in History within five years, using existing courses. This allows students an accelerated path to a higher degree that will give them greater access to positions in research, museum studies, and teaching opportunities in a shorter period.

This program will allow students to take up to 12 credits toward the MA in History concurrently during their senior undergraduate year.

Students will follow the 4-year plan for their major, except during semesters 7 and 8. In these semesters, they will substitute 12 elective credits with MA coursework.

To register for MA courses in year 4, students must apply to the MA program and receive conditional acceptance.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have at least 90 credits
- Minimum GPA of 3.0
