## Meet Mr. Farooq Kathwari





#### EVER WONDER, "WHO IS KATHWARI AND WHAT IS THE CONNECTION TO THE HONORS PROGRAM?" THIS IS FOR YOU!



March of 2015, Farooq Kathwari, President and CEO of Ethan Allen Interiors Inc., headquartered in Danbury, and his wife, Farida, gave a gift of \$1 million to create an endowment to support WCSU's Honors Program.

The President of WCSU at that time, James W. Schmotter stated that, "The Kathwari family and Western's Honors Program are a perfect match. Both epitomize dedication to excellence, recognition of the value of hard work, and commitment to making the world a better place. Faroog and Farida Kathwari's generous gift not only honors their son Irfan's memory; it also establishes a permanent foundation for educational experiences that will shape the lives of our Honors students."

Faroog Kathwari emigrated to the U.S. at the age of 21 to attend graduate school at New York University, where he earned his MBA. While a student, he began selling crafts from his home country of Kashmir, that were sent by his grandfather. While working on Wall Street for Rothschild Inc., where he became CFO at the age of 27, he met Ancell, and they agreed that Kathwari would join Ethan Allen, which in fiscal year 2023, had annual sales exceeding \$791 million.

"The Honors Program is very important," Kathwari said. "They are students who perform well and perhaps can use the extra help to further their education and careers. I believe these students will make a difference."

Over the past 8 years, Kathwari's gift has supported student's international and domestic study and internships, academic and professional development opportunities, events in collaboration with the local community, dynamic guest lectures, scholarships and other Kathwari Honors programming hosted in the Irfan Kathwari Honors House, named in memory of the Kathwaris' son.

Mr. Kathwari is a regular guest at Kathwari Honors Program events throughout the year, including Honors Convocations, Leadership Seminars and most recently, an Honors Meet & Greet event, pictured above.



## **Honors Course Spotlight**

#### COOKING & CONVERSATIONS WITH SPRING HONORS FACULTY

Honors students gathered in the Honors House kitchen with Professor Pano Koukopolos, who teaches HON 498 Navigating Life: A Survival Guide to Thrive in the Real World and Dr. Wynn Gadkar-Wilcox who teaches HON 398 Al and the Future of the Humanities, to hear more about their courses available in the Spring. Professor Koukopolos gave students a taste of what the course may be like by teaching them how to navigate an important part of life--cooking. The group learned to prepare a few simple and inexpensive appetizers like hummus, pico de gallo and focaccia with onion, tomato and cheese. The time shared together was filled with questions, stories and delicious food.







#### MEDITATION, BREATHING & YOGA NIDRA WITH PROF. AUTUORI

In her HON 498 Positive Health and Stress Management class, Professor Christel Autuori shared meditation techniques and practices, beginning with the three-part (belly breathing) breath to induce the relaxation response, and continued with a gentle yoga practice. Yoga is considered a meditation in motion, uniting the body, mind, and spirit. The class ended with the practice of "Yoga Nidra", a deep relaxation technique, often called Non Sleep Deep Relaxation (NSDR). It has been said that 30 minutes of Yoga Nidra can have the same effect on the body as two hours of sleep.
