

A Message to State Employees Regarding W-2 and 1095-C Forms:

This is an important message to all state employees regarding your 2019 tax forms!

First, to avoid any security risks when accessing Core-CT, always access Core-CT by entering the address directly through your web browser or through a link posted on an official State of Connecticut website. NEVER access it through a link emailed to you claiming to be from Core-CT because emailed links could be a phishing scam.

ELECTRONIC W-2 FORMS

Electronic W-2 forms for 2019 are now available online for all state employees who currently have access to Core-CT self-service direct deposit.

Employees can now view, print and save their 2019 electronic W-2 forms – as well as recent past electronic W-2 forms, when needed.

Reminder: Once logged in to the Core-CT system, the link to W-2/W-2c information will be in the “Payroll” section. When employees click “View W-2/W-2c Forms,” it will show the form for the most recent year. Above the link to that form will also be an option to “View a different tax year.” That link leads to all available current and prior W-2/W-2c forms dating back to 2011 if you wish to view prior years. Once a form is opened, employees may view, save or print it at any time.

Employees who encounter any difficulties in signing in to Core-CT, resetting a password or other technical issues, should please contact their agency security liaison. Please email CORECTIssues@wcsu.edu for assistance.

For those employees who still receive a printed form, it will be mailed in mid-January 2020 (an email will be sent to the agency payroll offices when all of the 2019 W2's have been mailed).

IRS FORM 1095-C

As was done last year, pursuant to the Affordable Care Act, all State of Connecticut employees enrolled in the state medical plan will receive IRS Form 1095-C ***by mail*** on or before March 2020. This form will be sent to you separately from other tax documents.

The 1095-C indicates which months during the year you and, if applicable, your dependents were enrolled in state-sponsored medical and prescription plans.

You do NOT have to attach Form 1095-C with your submitted federal income tax return. However, please keep the form with your income tax documents should the IRS or your tax advisors have a question regarding your coverage in the future.
