Macricostas School of Arts & Sciences World Languages & Composition Adjunct Teaching Position - Composition

Western Connecticut State University is seeking adjuncts instructors in the Department of World Languages and Composition for part-time teaching positions in Composition for the upcoming Fall 2024 semester as well as for future semesters. Most instruction will take place on ground.

Part-time instructors teach up to two sections of first-year writing. Instructors are invited to participate in regular, optional faculty conversations and professional development workshops.

Course Description: WRT 101: Introduction to Composition and Rhetoric. The goal for this course is for students to gain confidence and fluency with writing and reading at the college level. The course teaches students how to write for various rhetorical situations in academic and non-academic genres. Through complex readings, students gain rhetorical knowledge as they critically analyze the audience, purpose, genre, and context of various forms; this knowledge is applied to their own writing. Students gain an introduction to finding, evaluating, and incorporating sources to support their own ideas. In addition, students learn to reflect critically on their writing and themselves as writers to encourage independent writing and revision in the future. 3 credits.

Qualifications: Master's degree or Ph.D. in Composition and Rhetoric, English, Writing, or closely related field. Prior experience teaching college composition preferred.

The load credit for applicants holding a Master's degree (\$5,817 for a single 3-credit course) and \$2,119 per load credit for applicants holding an M.F.A or Ph.D. (\$6,357 for a single 3-credit course).
