Western Connecticut State University is pleased to announce applications are being accepted for part-time adjunct teaching position in the Social Sciences department in the discipline of Political Science for in-person courses for the 2025-2026 academic year.

Course Descriptions: The ability to teach American Government (PS 102) and World Governments (PS104 - an introduction to comparative politics) and upper divisions on special topics in American Government and related topics is strongly preferred. Course Modality: Candidates must be able to teach in person at the WCSU midtown campus in Danbury, CT. WCSU operates a course schedule of Monday/Thursday and Tuesday/Friday for 100- and 200-level classes, which differs from other universities in our region.

Qualifications: Candidates must possess a master's degree in political science or a related field. Candidates must possess expertise and the ability to teach PS 102 American Government, with ability to teach PS 104 World Governments and topical PS upper divisions preferred. Prior teaching experience at the collegiate level is preferred. Excellent written and oral communication skills, as demonstrated by professional activity and application materials, are required.

Salary & Benefits: The current minimum starting salary is \$2,026 per load credit (or a minimum of \$6,078 for a single 3 credit course).
