Course Modality: Candidates must be able to teach in person at the WCSU midtown campus in Danbury, CT. Laboratory sessions are 3-hr in length and start at 9:30am, 2pm, 5:30pm or 7pm.

Qualifications: Candidates must possess a master's degree in chemistry or a related field. Prior teaching experience at the collegiate level is preferred. Excellent written and oral communication skills, as demonstrated by professional activity and application materials, are required.

Salary & Benefits: The current minimum starting salary is \$2,026 per load credit (or a minimum of \$6,078 for a single 3 credit course). All employment, if offered, is contingent upon proof of citizenship or employability under the requirement of the Immigration and Control Act (IRCA) and the successful passing of a background check.
