ABOUT

Evan Allard joined the Connecticut State Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security (DEMHS) in 2025 as the Director of the Connecticut Intelligence Center (CTIC). The Director is responsible for leading the day-to-day operations of the CT Intelligence Center, the state's designated all-crimes intelligence fusion center responsible for supporting the homeland security of Connecticut.

Prior to joining DEMHS Allard served as an Intelligence Officer in the United States Marine Corps. As a lieutenant, Allard led the Scout Sniper Platoons for First Battalion, Third Marines and Second Battalion, Third Marines on Marine Corps Base Hawaii, in support of the Unit Deployment Program and several multinational exercises. Upon being promoted to First Lieutenant, Allard served as an Intelligence Officer for Third Marine Regiment, before executing a Permanent Change of Station to Virginia Beach, VA, where he served as the Combat Assessment Course Manager and Targeting Instructor on the Joint Staff.

In 2022, after separating from the United States Marine Corps, Allard joined the Department of Defense as a Senior Intelligence Analyst for the 17th Intelligence Squadron, 363rd Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance Group. His tenure at Langley Air Force Base included tours as the Senior Operations Lead for the Target Vulnerability Studies Flight, as well as the Senior Intelligence Analyst for the Intermediate Targeting Development flight and the newly formed Crisis Support Team.

Allard was born in Hartford, Connecticut, and holds degrees from Eastern Connecticut State University and the University of Connecticut.
