





Growing GIAR

- Ruby K. Worner Charitable Trust doubled funding from previous year to \$20,000
 - For underrepresented minorities
- Diabetes Research Institute \$5,000
- San Antonio Lighthouse for the Blind and Vision Impaired \$30,000
- Rudy Ruggles \$15,000 for interdisciplinary research
- Estate of Elenore Schewe \$55,555.55 final settlement to arrive later

Summary of GIAR

- We have doubled the number of applications received from people who identify as Black/African American in 2022
- We have increased Hispanic applicants from 8.5% in 2019 to 9.3% in 2022, and more than doubled our multi-ethnic applicants from 4.4% in 2019 to 10.3% in 2022.
- We have increased the number of Black/African American recipients by 4.5%
- We doubled the number of Hispanic recipients, and increased Multi-Ethnic recipients from 1% to 5% in fiscal year 2022
- In FY2022, the number of applicants who did not provide demographic information was decreased by 4.5%, compared to the FY2016-2020 applicant pool. This is due to our diversity statement we have added to the application

The Walston Chubb Award for Innovation is designed to honor and promote creativity among scientists and engineers.



The John P. McGovern Award is presented to individuals who have made outstanding contributions to science and the Society.



The George Bugliarello Prize is awarded to a superior interdisciplinary essay, review of research or analytical article published in American

Scientist magazine.



The Young Investigator Award recognizes excellence in research in physical sciences and engineering, including mathematics, and life and social sciences.



The William Procter Prize
is presented to a scientist who
has made an outstanding
contribution to scientific research and
has demonstrated an ability to
communicate this research to
scientists in other disciplines.



The Evan Ferguson Award is presented in recognition of outstanding service to the Society and its mission.
